**- « The Young Republic » - Marc Smith**

This class will overlook the birth, creation and development of the US republic. This will be done through the analysis of various historic texts such as The Declaration of Independence, George Washington's Farewell Address and James Monroe's Inaugural Speech. The goal will be to cover the historic events that built the nation from the beginning of Independence through the antebellum era, roughly from the 1770s to the 1840s. In order to be able to place the texts in their context, a historic knowledge of the period is required. Student's may refer themselves to:

**- « The Scottish question » - Béatrice Duchateau**

Le référendum pour l'indépendance du 18 septembre 2014 a remis la question écossaise en lumière. Entre les guerres d'indépendance au 13<sup>e</sup> siècle, l'Union en 1707 et le processus de dévolution engagé à la fin du 20<sup>e</sup> siècle, la nation écossaise s'est bâtie avec et contre son voisin anglais. Ce cours abordera l'histoire de l'Écosse mais s'appliquera davantage à analyser l'histoire du nationalisme écossais et à comprendre les paradoxes de cette nation sans état et la singularité de l'Écosse contemporaine.
